The Classic Cruising Experience

This summer, Adelaide will see the return of its first-ever cruise ship, with Classic International Cruises' stylish flagship, *Athena*, sailing to the SA capital for an extended, encore summer season in January and February 2010.

Two cruises between Adelaide and Perth and four return sailings from Adelaide are available, with value-for-money fares starting at just A\$435 per person, inside twin-share, for a two-night sojourn at sea – and that includes all onboard meals and entertainment.

In contrast to the rapid growth of ever-expanding resort-type superliners, with their rock climbing walls, boxing rings, skating rinks and long queues, Classic International Cruises offers a return to what it calls the 'Classic Cruising Experience' where crew escort passengers to their cabins on embarkation and know their names throughout the cruise in an intimate, friendly and relaxed setting.

In fact, attentive, old-fashioned service from the Australian and international crew and first-class cuisine are the hallmarks of the Classic Cruising experience. It's cruising as it was meant to be, with a sense of the ocean and all its mystery, adventure and nautical traditions, and that special personal touch often lacking in today's hectic age.

The elegant *Athena* is a stylishly traditional and solidly-built liner purpose-built for ocean cruising.

Athena is smaller than most cruise ships today, carrying just 600 discerning guests, but therein lays her appeal. She's easy to get around and boasts a special warmth and charming ambience – an authentic home-away-from-home with a rewarding camaraderie that only smaller vessels can provide.

Onboard, guests enjoy lazy days at sea and the many pleasure of shipboard life. Do it all, or nothing at all! Sip cocktails by the pool, take a turn around the wrap-around Promenade Deck, enjoy a gym work-out, feast on fine cuisine, catch a cabaret show or a movie, lounge in the piano bar and let your hair down in the disco – all the feel-good things that provide the perfect getaway at sea.

And then there's the ever-changing scenery. Unpack just once and a host of exciting destinations appear on the horizon.

Our ships have delighted European passengers for 26 years. For the past five years, we have offered thousands of passengers cruises to and from Australia, with many repeat guests bringing back friends and family to live it up at sea together. In fact up to 50 per cent of passengers on some cruises are repeat guests.

Our ships achieve a high 96 per cent ‘very good to excellent’ rating from passengers, with the onboard service, dining experience and entertainment singled out for the highest scores.

Classic International Cruises’ success in Western Australia from 2004 to 2007 led to the debut last summer (2008/09) of the line’s biggest liner, *Athena* in Fremantle and also Adelaide, where *Athena* was the first ship to offer round-trip cruises from the SA capital. And *Athena*’s popular maiden season here paves the way for her return here this summer for her 2009/10 program.

Named after the Greek goddess of wisdom and originally a transatlantic liner, the 16,200-ton *Athena* was completely rebuilt as a cruise ship in 1994 at a cost of US\$150m and refurbished in 2005. The mid-sized, eight-deck ship features a wrap-around promenade deck, many traditional wooden deck chairs, a pool, fitness centre and sauna, five bars and lounges, nightclub, showlounge, casino, library, boutiques, cinema, internet café, formal and casual restaurants and 276 spacious cabins – all with a bath/shower. All 43 suites, including eight balcony cabins, have jacuzzi baths.

Children’s activities operate during school holidays and the onboard currency will be Australian dollars. Fares include all gratuities, enhancing the value for money *Athena* offers passengers.

Encore 2009/10 Adelaide season for *Athena*

Athena will offer **six** cruises to and from Outer Harbour in Adelaide in January and February, 2010 (two more than in summer 2009):

- Five-night one-way cruise from Fremantle-Adelaide via Port Lincoln, sailing January 18, 2010, from **\$895** pp, twin-share
- First-ever return cruise from Adelaide to Tasmania, with the seven-night journey visiting Devonport, Port Arthur and Hobart. Sailing January 23, 2010, with fares from **\$1295** pp, twin-share.
Can be combined with 5-night Fremantle-Adelaide cruise to create a 12-night cruise from Fremantle to Tasmania and back to Adelaide
- Two-night ocean cruise to ‘nowhere’, departing January 30, 2010, from **\$435** pp, twin-share
- Four-night journey from Adelaide to Port Lincoln and Kangaroo Island on February 1, 2010, from **\$850** pp, twin-share
- Six-night one-way cruise from Adelaide to Fremantle via Port Lincoln and Esperance on February 8, 2010, from **\$1075** pp, twin-share

* *Athena* has also been chartered for a three-night cruise from Adelaide on February 5, 2010

On selected cruises, children can cruise for free (paying just gratuities and port charges) and supplements for singles in selected cabins are only 25-50 per cent, instead of double. And Classic International Cruises is also one of the few cruise lines to allow single travellers to share cabins to lower the fare.

Other, longer cruises to Asia, Europe and along the Western Australia coast are available aboard *Athena* from Fremantle.

Founded in 1982, Classic International Cruises carries 100,000 passengers a year, with the five-ship fleet offering cruises in Europe, the UK, South America and, since 2004, Australia.
