## **New Fly Cruise Packages Released For Princess Daphne's New Far East Program in Summer of 2010-11**

**From Only \$2465 including return flights to Singapore, 9-night cruise and a night in Singapore  
Deal from all States**

New fly/cruise packages, including Christmas and New Year voyages, have been released for Australians keen to explore the Far East aboard Classic International Cruises' Princess Daphne, next summer.

Six fly, cruise and stay holidays from eight to 15 nights are available between December 2010 and February 2011 from all States and each includes:

- return flights to Singapore
- one night's accommodation with breakfast in Singapore pre-cruise
- and a return Asia cruise from Singapore aboard the intimate, classic-styled liner, Princess Daphne.

The packages include:

- 10-night Christmas holiday package including a nine-night cruise from Singapore on December 19, 2010, to Phuket, Langkawi, Penang, Malacca and Kuala Lumpur from **\$3050** per person from **Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Adelaide** and **\$2785** from **Perth**, including a night in Singapore and return flights from Australia
- 10-night New Year's package including a nine-night cruise from Singapore on December 28, 2010, to Vietnam, Brunei and Malaysia from **\$3180** per person from **Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Adelaide** and **\$2915** from **Perth**, including a night in Singapore and return flights from Australia
- Eight-night package including a seven-night cruise from Singapore on January 6, 2010, to Phuket, Penang, Kuala Lumpur and Langkawi from **\$2730** per person from **Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Adelaide** and **\$2465** from **Perth**, including a night in Singapore and return flights from Australia

Adding to the savings is the opportunity for Australians to buy drinks, shore tours and other items onboard Princess Daphne in Australian dollars.

The 500-passenger Princess Daphne will be Classic International Cruises' biggest-ever vessel to be based in the Far East and the cruise line's 550-passenger Athena will also return to Australia next summer for her third season here, doubling the line's presence in the region.

Registered in Portugal and refurbished in 2008, the traditionally-styled Princess Daphne is purpose-built for ocean cruising and features five lounges and bars, elegant restaurant, gym/spa, library, casino, showlounge, spacious decks and 240 cabins, including 73 suites – six of which offer private balconies. A high 90 per cent of all cabins offer ocean views, mostly through traditional portholes.
