<i>Name:</i>	Named after a goddess in Greek mythology
<i>Registered/Flag:</i>	Madeira, Portugal
<i>Size/number of decks:</i>	15,833 tons/ 8 decks – Classed as a mid-sized liner
<i>Length/width:</i>	162m long/ 21 m wide
<i>Draft (under water)/Speed:</i>	7.8m – a deep draft designed for stability on ocean voyages/ 16 knots
<i>Passengers:</i>	508 with 200 crew
<i>Number of Cabins:</i>	241, including a high 73 suites. Six of the top suites have private balconies. A high 86 per cent of all cabins offer ocean views, mostly through traditional portholes. Almost all cabins have a bathtub – a luxury only found in suites on the latest superliners.
<i>Rebuilt/Last Refurbished:</i>	Originally named Port Sydney, she was totally rebuilt as a cruise ship in 1972. Last refurbished 2008.
<i>Features:</i>	Five lounges and bars including nightclub, showlounge and piano bar, elegant restaurant, gym/spa, library/internet centre, casino, boutique, spacious sundecks, pool, outdoor buffet area and wrap-around promenade deck. Children's activities during school holidays.
<i>Style of Cruising:</i>	Intimate small-ship cruising... In contrast to new huge resort-type superliners, Classic International Cruises offers a return to what it calls the 'Classic Cruising Experience' where crew escort passengers to their cabins on embarkation and know their names throughout the cruise in a friendly and relaxed setting. Attentive, old-fashioned service from the crew and first-class cuisine are the cruise line's hallmarks.
<i>Onboard currency:</i>	Australian dollars and Euros. Fares include all gratuities
